# **Highnam Parish Council Meeting**

Gambier Parry Hall: Tuesday 21st March 2023

**Present:** Cllrs C Coats, M Welch, V Tustin Smith, B Harding, P Dyche, J Smith, B Harding, B Nicol and W Badham.

**In Attendance:** Councillor P Mclain, 12 members of the public.

As a mark of respect for Councillor Phil Awford, the council acknowledged his passing and contribution to our parish by a one-minute silence.

Public Forum – Members of the public (MOP) may make representations, ask questions and give evidence at a meeting in respect of the business on the agenda by invitation of the chair.

The Chairman welcomed the public and invited members to raise matters of interest.

- Pot holes on the B4215, particularly prevalent at the mini roundabout at entrance to Oakridge.
- Cycle path is in a poor state following trimming of hedges. Debris have not been cleared up.
- Land at Cycle Path where burning rubble and discarding of building waste is an environmental eyesore. There have been sightings of large tipper trucks accessing the area. **Response: This is an agenda item being discussed.**
- Bus stop on the B4215 is used by children catching the bus for Newent School. The crossing on the corner and is very dangerous and children are using their mobile phones to tell others when the road is safe to cross. Can the council look at a safe road crossing?
- The Environmental Group are expecting the delivery of the bench and sculpture.

# 7. To receive Tewkesbury Borough Councillor's report

Cllr P Mclain presented his report:

- County Council tax has increased by 3.52% approx. £5 on a Band D property. Parish Precept average 4%, however there are some with an increase of 60% for example Maisemore. TBC have a surplus of £1.2m.
- Fly tipping is a concern in all localities. TBC identified two hotspots and in August 22 installed CCTV with success in reduction of tipping in that area.
- TBC housing supply is at 6.68%.
- TBC are striving to recruit GP's and Midwives, however there continues to be difficulties in acquiring prompt emergency appointments.
- The funeral of Cllr P Awford will take place at Tewkesbury Abbey 2pm 12 April.

#### 9. To receive and comment on Planning Applications

22/01374/FUL Linton Farm. Development of Energy Reserve Facility and Ancillary Infrastructure. A public consultation and presentation by STOR Power was organised at 18.30hrs 21<sup>st</sup> March 2024 before full council.

Councillor J Smith will not comment on this planning application due to her part of the Borough Planning Committee.

Action: Draft letter to be composed and circulated to councillors for comment prior to being submitted to the Planning Officer. Concerns raised, background noise/humming, environment/habitation and planting of trees. Grade 1 land, currently being used to grow wheat.

Request an extension to time to research further as still a lot more of information needed. A site visit with the planning officer, potential for another public consultation to raise further questions.

## 10. Environmental Working Group

#### 12. Public Works Loan Application (update)

Following the completion of the queries raised from the officer dealing with our application there is no update on the progress.

#### 13. Planning Committee Update

The setting up of a committee was deferred from February meeting. The proposal to invite 4 councillors to sit on the committee and co-opt non councillors with the appropriate experience. 8 in Councillors in favour, 1 abstention. 2 councillors put themselves forward therefore was insufficient nominations to continue. It was agreed this would be revisited after the May elections and a new council was elected.

#### 14. Lassington Recreation Development (Update)

Tenders were received by Tewkesbury Borough Council (TBC) and are being reviewed. Cllr Coats and Badham meet with TBC and evaluated the budget and proposed the council ringfence £1800 from reserves for a contingency. **Proposed Cllr C Coats, Seconded Cllr M Welch.**

## 15. Tipping on Land by Cycle Path

Previously the issue of the misuse of this land has been communicated to The Environment Agency, Gloucester County and City Council and Tewkesbury Borough Council. The proprietors have received three enforcement notices. However, the officer concluded there has been no breaches. The Parish Council disagree and agreed to write a letter to all of the above agencies, copying in Mark Harper (MP). **Action: Letter to be written**.
